



Winton Adventures

At the last minute I decided to go and assist with scrutineering at the Winton round of the V8's. After leaving Bendigo at 5.00am I was pleasantly surprised when on arrival at the track and parking the car I was greeted by David Dixon, who as usual told me where to go. Most people tell me where to go but at least Dave did it in a nice way. Unfortunately I learnt that Dave's back problem has only gotten worse and he has come to the reluctant decision that the race car has to go as he is in too much pain to use it. Knowing Dave this would have been a hard choice as he loves his circuit racing!

Signing in at the scrutiny bay and catching up with some people that I had not seen for a number of months I was assigned to the team looking after TCM's. I say "team" but since there were only twelve scrutineers to service the whole range of categories, only three people tended to the TCM's along with the category manager, who just happens to be John our firey from the Tarrengower event. Dianna the team leader was down from Newcastle and her first time as line chief as well as Felicity from South Australia, so you could say I was the rose between two thorns, or is that the other way round?

Most of the safety checks and gear inspection had been completed on the Friday so the tasks for the rest of the weekend were to do an audit on seven cars and observe and check cars on the pre grid then stand in pit lane when the race is on. Tires that are used on the TCM cars must be marked for the current race meeting, each team is allowed six new tires and they can use two used tires as well but those tires must be marked for the current meeting. For a reason I cannot explain one team neglected to get the tires marked. This was picked up in pre grid and after informing the category manager they were hit with a penalty, not happy but at least they will read the rules properly next time.

Auditing a car consists of picking several items from a list of checks. In this case it was checking seat mountings, condition and mounts of exhaust system, Roll cage identification, camera mounts, tow points, power module mountings' and kill switch operation. That just meant turning on ignition so that lights and dash worked then just getting the crew to pull the kill switch to make sure everything went off. The logbook of that car is then marked "audit complete" and that car will not be checked again for several meetings. In the course of a season all cars will probably be done twice.



A new entrant all the way from Rockhampton in Queensland arrived at the circuit on Thursday and literally unloaded the car from the transporter in boxes. It was an older car that they had bought and they put in almost a solid effort through to Friday night without a break. The car finally hit the track for race two of the weekend. Their radioman heard an almighty scream and much foul language as the car hit the first corner. Seems that there was a passenger in the form of the world's biggest huntsman spider and the driver hates spiders still to his credit he completed the race. Later in the garage area one of the sponsor's wives climbed into the car for a photo opportunity, I discreetly asked if they told her about the spider, all I got was a smile! One of the crew was returning home on Monday, said he would arrive about 4.30pm was then going to get changed. go off to his business and work till about two in the morning to complete a customer's car he had promised to them and would then restart his normal week on Tuesday. Isn't motorsport fun.

After each race we would also randomly weigh three cars so we would all split and go in different directions and make sure that the crews did not touch the car and that the driver stayed near it. Most drivers were happy but occasionally you get someone who has had a bad race and are "not happy Jan", but they always clam down as long as the car passes.

The most interesting part was after the last race when the weekend winner is put into Parc Ferme. This is usually done in the garage and the category manager will break the seal on the engine management module remove a USB style plug , puts in another marked 3000, then gets the crew to start the car and bring up the revs to check that the engine starts to break down at 3000 rpm. This makes sure that the control module hasn't been tampered with. The lucky car then gets a new plug with a 100 rpm reduction as a penalty for being too quick. If the car does not win again for a set number of races then that 100 rpm will be given back to them and on goes the merry go round.

After we were finished for the weekend I stupidly volunteered to watch the V8's for their race. This mostly consists of observing pit stops for anything out of the ordinary. After the race, cars were parked on a 45 degree angle in front of the garage where the teams are only allowed to loosen wheel nuts, put the car up on air jacks and remove the dry ice from the cool box. Other than that, there is no touching. Parc Ferme went on for one hour, during which time the data guy went to each car, plugged in a laptop and downloaded the data from each car to be analyzed later. Weight checks, track and wheelbase were also measured.

By the time we were released from Parc Ferme and I collected my gear I had missed most of the traffic getting out of the circuit. It was still about 7.30pm by the time that I got home. Seeing that I had accommodation at Wangarratta and that I had come back to Bennalla Saturday night for tea it meant that I had logged over 530kms for the weekend. Now I know how Mick the truckie feels!

While I may sound like I am complaining I really enjoyed the weekend and the people you meet at these meetings. Being an official in any capacity can be a rewarding experience and I recommend anyone to try it. There are many different facets and I am sure that there will be some form that you like. It also gets you closer to the action than just spectating.

Oh by the way, you know who won and you know that I couldn't care less so if you want results Google them.




